



### How To Get To Bordeaux Pôle Juridique et Judiciaire

Tram A & B. "Hôtel de Ville" station

#### From the Bordeaux Saint-Jean railway station (around 20 minutes)

Take tram C (direction "Gare de Blanquefort" or "Parc des expositions de Bordeaux") until "Porte de Bourgogne" station, then take tram A (direction "Le Haillan Rostand") and leave it at "Hôtel de Ville" station.



### How To Get To A21 Building

Tram B, "Béthanie" station

#### From Mériadeck (around 25 minutes)

Walk 5 minutes towards Gambetta square, then take tram B at "Gambetta – Musée des arts décoratifs" station (direction "Pessac centre" or "France Alouette") and leave it at "Béthanie" station.
